EXPLANATION:

The State of Hawaii received approval from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services for State Plan Amendment (SPA) Number 24-0001 "Yearly Optional State Supplementary Payment" on April 15, 2024.

Effective January 1, 2024, Supplemental Security Income (SSI) beneficiaries received a 3.2% Cost of Living Adjustment increase from the Social Security Administration. This Amendment is required to increase the monthly income standards for Domiciliary Care Type I from \$1565.90 to \$1594.90 and for Domiciliary Care Type II from \$1673.90 to \$1702.90.
