2025 Hawai'i DC:0-5™ Crosswalk Codes List

This crosswalk is being shared with Hawaii's mental health providers to increase awareness and use of the Diagnostic Classification of Mental Health and Developmental Disorders of Infancy and Early Childhood (DC:0-5™) to assess and diagnose children birth through age five. It is highly recommended that all clinicians using the DC:0-5™ and this crosswalk complete a training on the DC:0-5.

The intention of this crosswalk is to support Hawai'i's providers in connecting DC:0-5 diagnoses to DSM-5 and/or ICD-10 diagnoses for billing purposes.

This file provides a tabular (i.e., spreadsheet) version of the 2025 Hawai'i DC:0-5 Crosswalk, in order to support electronic system developers and administrative staff in programming DC:0-5 diagnoses into electronic health records and other databases. Each row represents one DC:0-5 diagnosis, along with the corresponding DSM-5 and ICD-10 diagnosis or diagnoses to which it is crosswalked. DC:0-5 diagnoses may be crosswalked to multiple DSM-5 and/or ICD-10 codes.

- 1) The age range column is meant to be a general timeframe when a condition might be present and not to restrict billing.
- 2) In the **ICD Code(s)** column, a letter "x" means that any number following the main code is acceptable (e.g., F43.1x would include any of the subcodes F43.10, F43.11, F43.12). Within each diagnosis category, clinicians using this crosswalk have the flexibility to select the ICD code that they deem most appropriate for the child they are assessing, diagnosing, or treating. Providers may submit multiple ICD codes for a specific condition but are not required to do so.

About the Hawai'i DC:0-5™Crosswalk

This publication was developed in Fall 2024 and Spring 2025, as one of the critical elements of Hawai'i's larger effort to build and strengthen the continuum of supports and services for keiki and the adults that care for them throughout the state. This continuum includes developmentally appropriate promotion, prevention, assessment, diagnosis, and treatment supports. A group of Hawai'i state agencies and nonprofit organizations has created the Hawai'i Diagnostic Classification of Mental Health and Developmental Disorders of Infancy and Early Childhood (DC:0-5™) Crosswalk as a reference tool to support mental health professionals in converting DC:0-5™ diagnoses to associated ICD-10 diagnostic codes and DSM-5 diagnoses. This reference tool is not intended to take the place of professional development in the form of training and ongoing supervision. Further, it does not dictate scope of practice. Professionals are encouraged to reference credentialing rules and guidance through the Hawai'i Department of Human Services and the Hawai'i Department of Health and consult with their professional associations regarding scope of practice considerations.

Limitations of This Crosswalk

As noted above, this crosswalk is a resource tool and is not intended to take the place of professional development in the form of training and ongoing clinical and reflective supervision.

This crosswalk was developed for the purpose of supporting Hawai'i's mental health professionals in the ability to assess and provide diagnoses for initiation of infant and early childhood mental health services; therefore, it only provides guidance on connecting Axis I Clinical Disorders from the DC:0-5™ to DSM diagnoses and ICD-10 codes. While gathering information from the other four axes indicated in the DC:0-5™ manual is a critical component for understanding the child and completing a thorough assessment, it is not necessary to capture this information in coding the principal mental health diagnosis on a claim.

Lastly, this crosswalk was developed with primary consultation from mental health professionals who work with keiki and their families and additional consultation from other medical professionals. Some diagnostic categories within the DC:0-5™ may benefit from additional consultation.

Definitions



This list defines terms and abbreviations, including acronyms, used in this reference tool.

DC:0-5™: The Diagnostic Classification of Mental Health and Developmental Disorders of Infancy and Early Childhood (DC:0-5™) is the internationally accepted system for developmentally appropriate assessment of young children's mental health. The DC:0-5™ uses developmentally specific diagnostic criteria and reflects mental health disorders that are typically diagnosed in infancy and early childhood.

DC:0-5™ Crosswalk: A DC:0-5™ crosswalk is a reference tool for mental health providers that helps to convert DC:0-5™ diagnoses to associated ICD diagnostic codes and DSM diagnoses.

DSM-5™: The Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, Fifth Edition (DSM-5) is the handbook used by health care professionals in the United States and much of the world as the authoritative guide to the diagnosis of mental disorders. DSM-5 contains descriptions, symptoms, and other criteria for diagnosing mental disorders.

ICD: The International Classification of Diseases (ICD) is a classification system used for the systematic recording, analysis, interpretation, and comparison of mortality and morbidity data across countries and regions. ICD ensures interoperability of data records.

ICD-10-CM: The International Classification of Diseases, Tenth Revision, Clinical Modification (ICD-10-CM) is a standardized classification system of diagnosis codes that represent conditions and diseases, related health problems, abnormal findings, signs and symptoms, injuries, external causes of injuries and diseases, and social circumstances. The ICD-10-CM is based on the World Health Organization's Tenth Revision, International Classification of Diseases (ICD-10). The National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS) and the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) are the U.S. government agencies responsible for overseeing all changes and modifications to the ICD-10-CM.

IECMH: Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health is the developing capacity of the child from birth to 5 years old to form close and secure adult and peer relationships; experience, manage, and express a full range of emotions; and explore the environment and learn – all in the context of family, community, and culture. Experts from a range of disciplines consider IECMH to be the foundation of healthy, lifelong development. IECMH is also a term used to describe the full continuum of services and supports (i.e., promotion, prevention, assessment, diagnosis, and treatment) necessary to promote healthy development, prevent mental health problems, and treat mental health disorders. (ZERO TO THREE)

Hawai'i DC:0-5™ Crosswalk Overview



Introduction

The Diagnostic Classification of Mental Health and Developmental Disorders of Infancy and Early Childhood (DC:0-5™) is the only internationally-accepted system for <u>developmentally appropriate</u> <u>assessment</u> of infants and young children's mental health and is recommended as a best practice by both the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (<u>CMS</u>) and Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (<u>SAMHSA</u>). It uses developmentally specific diagnostic criteria and reflects mental health disorders that are typically diagnosed in infancy and early childhood. Hawai'i is <u>among many states</u> who are working to integrate use of the DC:0-5™into state policies and systems.

The DC:0-5™ is the only clinically appropriate manual for the diagnosis of mental health conditions for infants and young children; however, other diagnostic systems may still be needed for insurance billing and documentation purposes. For Med-QUEST providers, <u>federal Medicaid guidance</u> requires that all claims be submitted with an ICD-10 (International Classification of Disease) code. In addition, some behavioral health providers may configure their electronic health record systems to use Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, Fifth Edition (DSM-5) diagnoses for clinical records. *The intention of this crosswalk is to support Hawai'i's providers in connecting DC:0-5™ diagnoses to DSM-5 and/or ICD-10 diagnoses for billing purposes.*

The DC:0-5[™] manual from ZERO TO THREE (2016) includes a crosswalk, but it is not regularly updated and does not account for state specific contexts including Medicaid coding and billing requirements. After reviewing the ZERO TO THREE crosswalk and crosswalks from several other states, this crosswalk was developed specifically by and for the use of Hawai'i's providers.

Crosswalk Development and Updates

This is the first Hawai'i DC:0-5™ crosswalk and was published in July 2025. It was developed in partnership with a workgroup of infant and early childhood mental health practitioners, health plan coding experts, and state agency representatives.

While no update schedule has been set for this crosswalk, it will be reviewed and updated on an as-needed basis at least once every two years, to account for any changes in the relevant diagnostic systems (DC:0-5™, DSM-5, and ICD-10). How to Use This Crosswalk




The Hawai'i' Department of Health and the Hawai'i's Department of Human Services, Med-QUEST Division, in collaboration with nonprofits including the Association for Infant Mental Health in Hawai'i (AIMHHI), are sharing this crosswalk with Hawai'i's mental health providers to increase awareness and use of the DC:0-5™ to assess and diagnose children birth through age five. *It is highly recommended that all clinicians using the DC:0-5™ and this crosswalk complete a training on the DC:0-5™.* After completing the multiple axis assessment processes (Axes II-V include reviewing medical history, caregiver interviews, developmental observations, and family and social context considerations) and identifying the appropriate Axis-I DC:0-5™ clinical diagnosis, providers can reference this tool to find the associated DSM-5 diagnosis* and/or ICD-10 diagnostic code. *Although the DC:0-5™ codes and five axes are not yet captured in encounter data, the five axes provide a more holistic understanding of infant and early childhood mental health and will be helpful to clinicians in developing a treatment plan.*

To support electronic system developers and administrative staff in programming DC:0-5[™] diagnoses into electronic health records and other databases, a tabular (i.e., spreadsheet) version of the 2025 Hawai'i DC:0-5[™] Crosswalk is available to download (see Appendix B).

Note: This crosswalk is not intended to take the place of a full mental health assessment, nor to replace clinical judgement. Some DC:0-5™ diagnoses crosswalk to more than one DSM-5 or ICD-10 diagnosis. This indicates that there may be multiple options that could be appropriate based on the symptom criteria included in the various diagnostic tools. Providers are encouraged to reference the DSM-5 and ICD-10 for further information about the associated diagnoses.

^{*} This crosswalk includes the ICD-9 codes that were crosswalked to DSM-5 diagnoses in the DSM-5 manual prior to 2022, recognizing that some behavioral health providers may still program electronic health record systems with ICD-9 codes, or refer to these ICD-9 codes as DSM codes.

- 1) The **age range column** is meant to be a general timeframe when a condition might be present and not to restrict billing.
- 2) In the **ICD Code(s) column,** a letter "x" means that any number following the main code is acceptable (e.g., F43.1x would include any of the subcodes F43.10, F43.11, F43.12). Within each diagnosis category, clinicians using this crosswalk have the flexibility to select the ICD code that they deem most appropriate for the child they are assessing, diagnosing, or treating. Providers may submit multiple ICD codes for a specific condition but are not required to do so.

Appendix A | Development of the Hawai'i DC:0-5™ Crosswalk



As part of a larger effort to identify financing opportunities for infant and early childhood mental health (IECMH) in Hawai'i, in Fall 2024 and Spring 2025, a workgroup of representatives from Hawai'i's Department of Human Services, Med-QUEST Division, two IECMH clinicians, and two representatives from a Hawai'i health plan partnered to create a draft of the Hawai'i DC:0-5™ Crosswalk. The crosswalk draft was created after reviewing the national crosswalk from ZERO TO THREE, as well as crosswalks from Massachusetts and Washington, and a National Center on Children and Poverty (NCCP) report comparing several other state crosswalks to the ZERO TO THREE crosswalk. The workgroup is tremendously appreciative of other state efforts and their willingness to share their crosswalks and crosswalk development processes.

Workgroup members reviewed variations between the ZERO TO THREE and other existing DC:0-5™ crosswalks in their considerations prior to reaching a consensus regarding the Hawai'i ICD codes. Changes were made from the ZERO TO THREE crosswalk to align with current DSM-5 and ICD-10 coding standards, as well as Med-QUEST billing guidance. The workgroup reviewed each DC:0-5™ diagnosis to arrive at a consensus on the appropriate ICD-10 diagnoses to be included in the crosswalk. The workgroup considered the following in determining the Hawai'i ICD codes:

- Best clinical fit between DC:0-5™ and ICD-10 diagnoses based on experience with Hawai'i's keiki and families
- Whether the ICD-10 diagnoses are billable under Med-QUEST and other billing systems.

After the draft Hawai'i DC:0-5™ Crosswalk was completed, approximately 20 IECMH and primary care clinicians were invited to review the crosswalk and provide feedback based on experience in their practice. The workgroup appreciates the important clinical insights provided by these reviewers.
