"They Are Worthy": Increasing Empathy and Reducing Stigma Toward Individuals with Substance Use Disorders

Substance misuse and overdose deaths are increasing in Hawai'i. To better identify substance misuse early, prevent worsening, and provide interventions and treatment, **Med-QUEST**, along with our partner Health Management Associates, is providing an **online interactive session on Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT).** SBIRT is an evidence-based practice that is reimbursable.

Stigma and shame are major barriers to individuals being screened and receiving treatment for substance use disorder (SUD). In this interactive webinar, we will discuss the layers of stigma that an individual may experience and how we can mitigate them. We will discuss the role that childhood trauma plays in increasing risk for SUD and ways to build empathy.
